



Blast From The Past

t was January 31, 1928, 85 years ago this month, when Apostle Ishmael D'Amico of Detroit arrived in Sopris, Colorado, to initiate one of the more profound evangelistic experiences in our Church history. Received by the Cerames, a husband and wife who had been baptized in Detroit a few months prior but since moved back to their home in Colorado, Brother Ishmael was met as well by a minister of another church, Paul Costa. Accompanied by numerous experiences before and during the trip, the Spirit so moved Paul Costa that when he invited Brother Ishmael to meet his own congregation he announced to them, "From this day on, it will not be my place to preach to you. This man is a man of God, and he will preach to us." Paul Costa and his daughter were soon baptized. Others followed, and in April of that year Brother Costa was ordained an elder and placed in charge of the new mission, set under the auspices of the Detroit Branch.

hey greet you from T-shirts, hats, and/or sweatshirts, as their owners remain enthusiastic about explaining their loyalty to these exhibitions. But you needn't leave your home to see them, as just as many announcements of sports teams, social issues, and music groups are posted on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

Passionate people publicly express themselves through these conversation starters, regardless of relevance.

Yet, there is nothing more relevant than the love of God. Often we are influenced about favorite teams through friends or family, but the love of God comes to us through an extraordinary invitation. John explains, "We love God because He first loved us" (I John 4:19). We might infer from John's claim that without God's loving extension to us, we may not be inclined to love Him. If that is the case, then He personally won each one of us over.

"For this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth." (John 18:37)

I have numerous early memories of God's personal outreach to me (i.e., childhood healings) before I ever glanced His way. His declarations of love remain much more relevant than some regionalized devotion to a college football team. His relevance deserves our addressing it.

Testimony, in a natural setting (courtroom), is: "a statement given by an eye-witness while under oath," so their assertions become the evidence. Testimony, in a spiritual setting (church, home, work, bus-stop, etc.), is: "an open proclamation of a religious conversion or experience." Again, the result is that the testifiers become proof to the truth! Spiritual testimony includes 3 components:

- 1) WHERE one was before Christ
- 2) HOW one came to believe in and trust Jesus Christ
- 3) WHAT changes Jesus made in one's life

The Word addresses this powerful tool: "Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord" (2 Timothy 1:8), "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ" (Romans 1:16), "Shew how great things God hath done unto thee" (Luke 8:39), and "Be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15).

Consider your conversion testimony (Where? How? What?). Do you maintain it and keep it alive? Have you moved it forward through upgrades & updates (added personal experiences)? Your testimony is not intended to lay dormant, so build upon the past with focus on the future. Your relationship with God began reactively to His love, but you can proactively enhance your relationship by developing it through praying, fasting, and meditating.

This more intimate relationship with your Savior will accommodate your identifying His expectations of you and your desires of Him, and help you realize all you desire from life. If your neighbor willingly touts their allegiance to some random professional sports team, how much more should you be "ready to give an answer" concerning the love of God? Your life, lived through God's influence, is your T-shirt!

Most people's allegiance is influenced by proximity. Consider the impact of your testimony on those around you. Example: You share your testimony with me, and "YOURS" becomes "MINE." I share it with others, confirming it as "OURS!" "THEY" become "US," and "WE" grows to be larger, as all of us become "HIS" ... all because you willingly shared your "Where," "How," and "What."

Brother Paul Liberto spoke next. He stated that the brothers in the ministry want us to be righteous. We don't need anything other than what we already have, to cross that river. We have everything we need through Christ and His Holy Spirit. He urged us to focus on all the good things we have; remember when we first came to the Lord, so happy to be part of God's family. Our brothers and sisters loved us! The brothers gave their all for us! We need to be of the mind that Joshua had—not to be afraid. We are living in Zion! First John states, "Greater is the Spirit that is in you, than he that is in the world." God can and will equip us for the battles through the power of prayer of the people of God! God has given us a greater understanding through the Book of Mormon. We said, together as a pledge, the words of 1 Nephi 13:37. We need to endure to the end.

Brother Pete Giannetti followed. He told the congregation that we have a perfect brightness of hope: that is unshaken faith and the love of God. The theme around the throne of God will be, the love of God! There was a series of gates to the tabernacle of the Lord in the wilderness, with the Holy of Holies at the center. No one could go in unless they were

sanctified of the Lord. The first set of gates were shut for 1,260 years when the priesthood authority of the Church was removed, until the Gospel came forth. Then the gates opened.

Another gate was right after Pentecost when the glory of God came down among the Apostles of our Lord. Peter at the gate Beautiful had received the gift of power that Jesus had promised to the Apostles.

God is letting us know that He wants us ready to give every man the reason for the hope that is in us; to SHARE this Gospel. The Lord wants us to become righteous. Brother Pete encouraged us to pledge that today, I will exercise faith in Jesus Christ. I will trust Him to fulfill His promises, even if that fulfillment is delayed. I will remember that the act of believing—and sustaining that belief over time—counts as righteousness.

Our conference ended with a beautiful time of fellowship with the saints from our region, and a renewal of hope for what God has in store in the near future for all of His people.

Flat Sonbeams Travel with the NAOC and IMOC

wo recent trips to Africa included a historic event for The Church of Jesus Christ's missionary efforts. The trips to Malawi and Zambia not only included four brothers, but four sisters and eight children. That's right, eight children between the ages of 4 and 12 years old! I am sure you are asking yourself, "How could the children make this trip? How could their parents allow them to go to Africa?" These children made the trip through participation in the Flat Sonbeam program.

The Flat Sonbeam Missionary program began in 2018 and is now under the oversight of the Quorum of Seventy Evangelists Youth Ministry. The mission of this program is to enable our children, ages 4 through 12, to experience missionary work firsthand through the ministry of The Church of Jesus Christ. This program will assist in encouraging and mentoring our children on the importance of the Church's commissions of outreach to The House of Joseph and all nations, kindreds, tongues, and people. To date, over 50 children have "traveled" to seventeen different countries and a half dozen House of Joseph works.

How does this program work? It starts with the child creating their personalized Flat Sonbeam using the template

that is provided. A headshot photo is taken to make it complete. The Sonbeam is now ready to travel. When a trip is approved in the RIP System, the missionaries are contacted about taking a Flat Sonbeam with them.

The traveling missionary will receive a packet from the Travel Agent which includes the Flat Sonbeam and a Travelogue Journal. The missionary will take pictures with the Flat Sonbeam throughout the trip. Creative pictures with the missionaries, in-country members, scenery, signs, etc. are all encouraged. The missionary records a daily summary in the Travelogue Journal of the happenings during the trip to share with the Sonbeam back home. Pictures with descriptions can be sent back to the TCOJC Travel Agent during the trip. The pictures are posted on the Flat Sonbeam Facebook Page (TCOJC Flat Sonbeams Going Abroad) for the Sonbeams and Church members to follow.

This program creates an awareness of the trip to encourage members to support the missionaries in prayer. A devotional calendar with a daily scripture is posted on the Flat Sonbeam Facebook page mentioned previously. Periodic updates and pictures sent by the missionary are also posted to the site.

Is Hell For Real?

ood people can be found in every city and village. In any catastrophe, locals risk their lives to save others. Unbelieving doctors dutifully save the lives of their patients everyday. This world is filled with untold evils, wickedness and suffering, but it is also filled with atheists living paradoxically both unrepentant *and* "good". Do "good" people go to heaven and "bad" people go to hell? How can a good God permanently judge mankind for temporary acts of sin? Is hell a real place? The world struggles to answer such consequential concerns.

The Book of Mormon leaves no room for doubt—hell is real and referenced over 50 times. 2 Nephi 9 describes hell as a spiritual death and as a lake of fire and brimstone with flames that never end. Satan drags his children down to hell (see Alma 30:60). It is awful (see 1 Nephi 15:29; Alma 19:29; 54:7) and has no end (see 1 Nephi 14: 3-4). It has gates, meaning you can enter into it (see 2 Nephi 4:32; 3 Nephi 18:13), and those who enter are bound with chains (see Alma 5:7-10; 26:14) and tormented with pain (see Jacob 3:11-12; Alma 36:13).

Jesus Christ will be the just judge on our fateful judgment day (see 2 Tim 4:1; 3 Nephi 27:15-16). Many people ask the question today, "Are you saved?" or "Have you been saved?" For those baptized unto Christ and sealed by the Holy Spirit, we answer with prophetic hope. We *shall be* saved is a phrase used 17 times in the New Testament and 19 times in the Book of Mormon. This penultimate judgment of Christ happens on the last day (see 1 Nephi 22:31; 2 Nephi 33:12; Alma 1:4; 3 Nephi 27:6).

Judgment lies with Christ, and not humanity. There will be no disputes or rebellion when we stand before the pleading bar of God. God does not look upon sin with the least degree of allowance (see Alma 45:16). Truly:

...no flesh...can dwell in the presence of God, save it be through the merits, and mercy, and grace of the Holy Messiah, who layeth down his life according to the flesh, and taketh it again by the power of the Spirit, that he may bring to pass the resurrection of the dead, being the first that should rise.

Wherefore, he is the firstfruits unto God, inasmuch as he shall make intercession for all the children of men; and they that believe in him shall be saved.

And because of the intercession for all, all men come unto God; wherefore, they stand in the presence of him, to be judged of him according to the truth and holiness which is in him... (2 Nephi 2:8-10)

Jesus Christ judges perfectly. He answers the ends of the law through His life and atoning sacrifice, which will allow all mankind to stand before Him for judgment. This is not a measurement of good versus bad in terms of human nature. Instead, a heavenly nature must dwell inside of us to allow us to inherit the divine. The measurement of salvation is Christ's name on our foreheads and in our hearts. The indwelling Holy Spirit seals us unto salvation. The fruits follow the faithful who endure to the end. Judgment will not be a measurement of who did the most good deeds relative to humanity. It will be an examination to witness the Spirit of God living inside of us, which propels His chosen to declare Christ Jesus and bring forth His Zion. Flesh cannot judge the Spirit for eternity, but the Lord will.

his year my grandson, Josiah, turned *seven* years old. *Seven* for him means that he is a second grader; he has achieved the art of balance and super hero speed on his new 20-inch bike; losing his front teeth was not as scary as he thought it might be; being able to read has opened a whole new world of adventure and having a little sister can be annoying, but she can also be pretty good company. At *seven*, these characteristics identify important things about him and the maturing process of his life's journey.

The number *seven* is symbolic of God's completion and perfection. At the March 2024 Fellowship Day, the Midwest Area Ladies' Uplift Circle dove into the Gospel of John, examining *seven* claims Jesus made about Himself that identified Him as the Messiah. Our goal: Understanding that the character of Christ (the Great I AM) changes who we are, thus aligning us more perfectly to the will of God for our lives and to the maturing process of our identity and spiritual journey as well.

He is the Rock, his work is perfect: for all his ways are judgment: a God of truth and without iniquity, just and right is he. (Deuteronomy 32:4)

Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect. (Matthew 5:48)

Unpacking Seven Characteristics and Truths of Jesus Christ

1. I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE (John 6:36, 48, 51)

Reality: On multiple occasions throughout the gospels, Jesus fed the multitudes... seven loaves and two fish (Matthew 15, Mark 8)... He used the natural (things people could relate to) to open their spiritual eyes.

Spirituality: Through faith and belief in Him, we become spiritually satisfied; we also gain great hope in eternal life with Him.

2. I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD (John 8:12)

Reality: We live in a world that is filled with sin and darkness which clouds and distorts our natural and spiritual vision.

Spirituality: Christ came to be the light and life of men. His light exposes our sin and becomes life-changing—a guiding light that directs and orders the steps of all who choose to follow Him.

3. I AM THE DOOR OF THE SHEEP (John 10:7, 9)

Reality: We are all led astray by the things that this world and Satan have to offer. The thief comes to steal and destroy.

Spirituality: No one can come to the Father except through Him. Whoever responds to the voice of Christ and follows Him and endures shall be saved and find peace in His pastures.

4. I AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD (John 10:14)

Reality: The relationship between the shepherd and his sheep is one of love, protection and guidance.

Spirituality: God the Father sent His only begotten son to be our Shepherd to guide us and point the way to His kingdom here on earth and His kingdom in heaven. His pursuit of us is grounded in pure love and life-giving affection for us.

5. I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE (John 14:6)

Reality: Natural death is inevitable. No one is exempt from this reality. Eventually, our time on earth will come to an end.

Spirituality: Facing death with unwavering hope in the risen savior brings forgiveness and a newness of hope in everlasting life with Him.

6. I AM THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE (John 11:25)

Reality: Today—anything goes and there is a call to tolerance. There are no absolutes. Truth is relative and based on whatever you believe.

Spirituality: Christ fulfilled the Old Testament prophecies. He was and is and always will be. He is the Way—because He is the Truth—because He is the life.

7. I AM THE TRUE VINE (John 15:1, 5)

Reality: Without a connection to a vine, the branch withers and dies and cannot bear fruit

Spirituality: We must be connected to (or abide in) the true Source of life and truth to receive nourishment for our souls. Abiding deeply allows Christ to emanate through us to the world.

So many spiritual truths to glean from! Any one of these seven identifiers is worth further "digging" and study time. Building our lives upon the "GREAT I AM" will change who we are so that we become a reflection of Him.

The Circle Sisters enjoyed precious fellowship during lunch. Based on the scripture "I am the true vine", Sisters Christina and Nina DiCenzo coordinated a Paint and Praise activity. Each picture painted was beautifully unique and remains a reminder of the importance of nurturing our walk with the Lord, so that His character becomes ingrained into who we are... essential to perfecting our walk with Him.

When the Sonbeam ages out of the program, she or he will receive their Flat Sonbeam and a "Passport" from the TCOJC Travel Agent stamped with the places that their Flat Sonbeam has traveled.

There are many interactions between the missionary and the child through this program. It has not only been an enlightening experience for each child, but an uplifting one for the missionaries involved. Several parents of Sonbeams have been moved to tears to think that the missionaries would take the time to include their child in this experience. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Our goal is to show the importance of fulfilling the commissions of The Church of Jesus Christ: Our Divine Commission, to preach the pure Restored Gospel to the indigenous people of North, Central and South America, and the Great Commission to take the Gospel to every nation, kindred, tongue, and people.

The Church of Jesus Christ has a glorious role to play in God's latter-day plan. Through the Q70, NAOC, and IMOC, we strive to follow the Spirit of God in preaching and teaching the Pure Restored Gospel of Jesus Christ wherever He sends us. Jacob 5:71 states, "And the Lord of the vineyard said unto

them (his servants); Go to, and labor in the vineyard, with your might. For behold, this is the last time that I shall nourish my vineyard; for the end is nigh at hand, and the season speedily cometh; and if ye labor with your might with me ye shall have joy in the fruit which I shall lay up unto myself against the time which shall soon come." We can easily see that we are in the last days. Our desire is to labor for the Lord in His vineyard.

We continue forward in the face of opposition with confidence that the Lord will guide and protect us. We teach, through our experiences, the importance of fulfilling our commission through positive and negative circumstances. We trust in the Lord of the vineyard for our direction, strength, and protection, knowing that we are laboring that we may have joy in the fruit in the storehouse of our Heavenly Father.

What better way to pass along the missionary focused spirit to our children than while they are still young. Our prayer is that through their participation in this program, a seed of outreach to others may be planted in each child. One year when it seemed like a lot of things had gone pretty wrong in my life, I kept coming to The Church of Jesus Christ, asking the Elders and Ladies' Circle members to please, please pray for me and my little girl. They did. I felt desperate many times, but I kept trying to do my life the right way according to God's guidance. I certainly followed God's laws to the best of my ability.

Later in that year, a very educated Social Worker commented to me that I had (what she called) a "magical life." Shocked, I started reminding her of all the trouble and things that had gone wrong, and all the trials and troubles we'd gone through. Looking very confused, she replied, "But everything worked out for you!" Yes, it did! I serve the one true God!

She was so right. With prayers and a grateful heart, troubles had worked out! In the Bible, we have a similar amazing story. In those old days, huge killing armies constantly attacked other countries to rob them of their gold and silver, anything of value. They also took families away to be sold as slaves.

There were no airplanes, bombs, guns, phones, or modern weapons yet invented. These huge armies fought with spears, swords, swift chariots, and by surrounding walled cities to cut off all food and starve the people so they would give in.

The King of the land was Hezekiah, a grandson of Jehoshaphat and King David. (See II Kings Chapters17-20.) King Hezekiah had taught his people to serve our one true God. They did not worship statues or any horrible religion that hurt people. They followed the Ten Commandments, which teach us it is wrong to make carved images or statues of any kind and pray to them! God was pleased that His people did right. He heard their prayers, as He hears ours.

So, when the huge armies from the big

country of Syria marched to his city and threatened to kill, take captive, and murder everyone, Hezekiah and his people prayed! When the army demanded their gold and silver, they took all their silver and gave it to them. They pulled their gold off the columns and walls and sent it. But the Assyrians wanted more!

The big army sent a messenger and a letter saying how they had conquered all the other cities, no matter what gods they served, and they'd destroy these followers of God. They wanted to frighten the King and his people into giving up. But Hezekiah began praying and put on clothes for mourning. The other men of God and the prophets joined him. He took the letter to the Temple (Church) and laid it before God. (See II Kings 19:19.) He begged God to protect them so the whole world would know that there was only one God!

And God answered him and told him to tell the Syrian king's messenger, "I have heard everything you have said about me and seen your rage and plans to destroy this people. But I am telling you, King of Assyria (camped outside the walls with huge armies), You shall not come into this city, or even shoot an arrow there, or attack it with your shields... You will return home by the same way you came! I will defend this city to save

it, for My own sake and because I promised My servant David (so many years ago)."

And it came to pass that night, the angel of the Lord went out and struck down one hundred eighty-five thousand of the enemies! Can you imagine that terrible sight? They did not attack God's people!

So, Hezekiah's enemy, the King of the Assyrians, turned and rushed for home. He returned to the big city of Nineveh. And as he was worshipping one of his false statue gods, his own sons attacked him with a sword, killed the bad king, and escaped to another country!

And prayerful, good King Hezekiah and the whole city of people were saved by our one true, living God!

This is the great God that WE know, love and serve today. He is our friend who truly cares about us. God wants us to pray and talk to Him in the name of Jesus. Try it. Your bad year can become a blessed one when you look back on it! It's true!
