here is simply nothing more important since the creation of the world than the events that occurred the week Jesus was crucified and resurrected. 

Buddha, Muhammed, Confucius, and Krishna were among those who introduced spiritual messages, attracting millions of followers. However, none claimed God's authority as the "only begotten son." None were authorized to provide direct access to their personal "Heavenly Father." None resurrected, nor offered mankind the needed transformation from earth to heaven after death. All were seemingly kind, well-intended, and focused upon mankind's betterment, but none possessed the power to finish with salvation.

Only Jesus, the Christ.

His resiliency resulted in accomplishing all God intended, completing His Father's "To-do" list. He iterated and reiterated His promise, "I am the resurrection and the life: He that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall He live, and whosoever liveth and

believeth in me shall never die" (John 11:25). He was unwilling to break these promises and He never did. He understood mankind depended upon His dependability, "If Christ be not raised, your faith is in vain; ye are yet in your sins!" (I Corinthians 15:17).

With pledges made, teachings nearly completed, Jesus returned to Jerusalem. As He entered the city, He confronted the looming temptation to abandon His purpose, "Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father, save me from this hour: but for this cause came I into this hour (John 12:27-28). He acknowledged His humanness, knowing what only He knew was about to happen to Him. He could easily have chosen to avoid such suffering, as His first option included requesting His Father's rescue. Save Himself at the expense of all mankind. But He immediately overcame His flesh with fearlessness. He knew His crucifixion was the reason His Father sent Him to mankind and only He could save us from our fall. So, He refused to quit.

In His last moments of freedom, He faced His greatest temptation for one final time, "O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt" (Matthew 26:39). Later He identified Peter's

weakening, "The spirit is indeed willing, but the flesh is weak" (v. 41). Ironically, both men had experienced similar variations of this. Peter stood down. Jesus stood up. The Son of God refused to quit.

The Savior endured the humiliation and horror of a false arrest, false accusations, false charges, false conviction, and wrongful death by crucifixion. Despite mankind's torturous physical and mental abuses, Jesus claimed victory for mankind just prior to taking His last breath, "It is finished" (John 19:30).

He was saying, "Father, you see I never quit!"

You see it is the same concerning you. He will never stop extending His mercy, His comfort, and His forgiveness to you, because He refuses to ever quit on you either! Honor His conviction, His strength, and His love by also never giving up on yourself. Avoid the mistake of questioning your calling in an "Oh-wretched-man-that-l-am" moment! When you do this, you question Him directly for choosing you. As Jesus fulfilled His father's purpose for Himself, you must fulfill His purpose for you. Never quit.

Because He certainly never did.

### Denying My Pride (to Gain Awe and Wonder)

[Quick note right off the bat] When I refer to "pride," I don't mean "self-regard" or "self-worth." Those are good! We are God's creation, and that makes every soul valuable. I'm talking about pride as self-exultation. Setting myself on a pedestal. Thinking more highly of myself than I do of my fellow humans and even of God. [End note]

Do you know someone who is always right?

They aren't (truly) right all the time...but they think they are. Even when they're not.

All of their opinions are facts. (Don't argue.)

Bring up any random topic, and they're an expert on it. (Don't question.)

They say everything with a tone of absolute certainty. (Don't doubt.)

If you do decide to argue, question, or doubt anything they say, then you quickly realize that this person isn't interested in a two-way conversation. (Why bother listening to you? What could you possibly tell them that they don't already know?)

I've known people like this. They can drive me crazy. But ya' know what else is crazy? As much as I think know-it-alls are crazy, I've been crazy like this before.


At certain points in my life (#teenyears) I knew it all. (Look at me! I'm 19 and I'm a genius in all things life!)

Even now, there are certain topics that I know a lot about. When I discuss them, I can't help myself. I put on my pedantic pants and bestow a lesson upon anyone who is polite enough to not run away.

The root of this behavior is pride. There are scads of ways that pride shows up in our lives. This is just one example.

And the main point I want to get across is this: Pride makes me lose touch with reality.

I've set myself so high that everything else in the world is below me. (Not reality.)



I've made myself so big that everything else in the world is small. (Not reality.)

There's nothing for me to look up to. Nothing to inspire awe and wonder.

Again...not reality.

Pride Makes Me Unteachable

Pride tosses self-awareness out the window. I've got an over-inflated view of myself. I'm the fount of all knowledge. (If only people would listen to me...)

The result?

I become unteachable.

Not only to my boss. Not only to my parents and family members who are looking out for me. Not only to my church family who cares about my spiritual welfare. But also...

...to God. (Eeeep!)

Scripture says that one of the hallmarks of a true disciple is having a teachable spirit.

"Poverty and shame shall be to him that refuseth instruction: but he that regardeth reproof shall be honoured." (Proverbs 13:18)

Pride rejects this. It says, "I'm the teacher, not the student." Pride tells me not to pray for wisdom. Not to read scripture for wisdom. It stands in direct contrast to Proverbs 2:6:

"For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding."

But who needs God when I have my own superior intellect?

That's the primrose path that leads to Galatians 6:3:

"For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself."

By the time I get to this point, I've completely broken with reality.

God isn't real.

God isn't good.

God isn't all-powerful.

God isn't interested.

God isn't competent.

Exalting myself and holding God in contempt...it narrows my vision and makes my world small and paltry.

If I'm the biggest and best thing in my world, then there's nothing for me to look up to, nothing to inspire me with awe and wonder.

Sad, huh?

Check out these scriptures. They describe the nonsense that a pride-riddled heart proclaims.

"For thou hast said in thine heart, I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God ... I will be like the most High." (Isaiah 14:13-14)

"Thou hast said in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me." (Isaiah 47:10)

"Because thine heart is lifted up, and thou hast said, I am a God, I sit in the seat of God." (Ezekiel 28:2-10)

"In the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud." (2 Timothy 3:1-2)

Bottom line? I want to be my own God. I want to be the ultimate authority. I want to decide what's good and bad. I don't want anyone else telling me what to do because (Continued on page 7)

### **Ignominious**

ave you ever looked up the definition of ignominious? In case you are like me, you haven't. Here are some synonyms: humiliating, disgraceful, shameful, and reprehensible. Wow, that is some collection of foul and offensive words.

The word ignominious only appears once in the Scriptures, as does the word ignominy, but what does this have to do with Jesus? He was worshiped by thousands before His death. Apostle Nathanael said to Jesus, "Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel." Additionally, Apostle Peter said, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God."

At the end of His ministry, Jesus was confronted by the rulers and teachers as to why He allowed His disciples to say, "Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord: peace in heaven, and glory in the highest." These Pharisees said, "Master, rebuke thy disciples. And He answered and said unto them, I tell you that, if these should hold their peace, the stones would immediately cry out."

But upon Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion, most of these same people went their separate ways, back to their routines, acting like nothing occurred. Who put Jesus in this situation? The Romans?, the Pharisees?, the Sanhedrin?, the people? No, it was God himself. He knew that a great and infinite sacrifice had to be made to atone for the sins of all men and women, including me and you! To reconcile us to Himself.

Jesus' teachings were marvelous, melodies to the heart and mind. His healings shook the foundations of sickness and disease. His mercies showered the people with hope and a better tomorrow. But what about the price of such blessings? Who will mark the time of salvation and redemption from the fiery pit prepared for the wicked?

The people had a choice. Either they could stick with Jesus, since their souls finally found peace and tranquility, no longer at odds, out of favor, and cut off from God. The Romans cruelly acted out the wishes of the Sanhedrin, abusing and then crucifying Jesus.

## **5 Amazing Facts**



### Why is the Tomb Emty? By Brother Jerry Valenti

he Jewish leaders of the time knew it was going to happen. Somehow, the body of Jesus was going to depart from the tomb. They demanded that guards be posted there (Matthew 27:62-66), but it happened anyway. On the third day, the tomb was empty! Multiple explanations have surfaced over the years as to why the tomb was empty. Here are 5 amazing facts that list five possible explanations—only one is the right one.

**Conspiracy** – One explanation is that the disciples conspired to steal the body of Jesus and then concocted a hoax that He had resurrected. In fact, the chief priests paid the soldiers at that time to say that was what happened (Matthew 28:11-15). Obviously, the chief priests knew this was not what happened, since they were willing to pay the soldiers to lie. Also, if the disciples had done this, it's unlikely they would have been willing to devote their lives and even be martyred for such a hoax.

Jesus wasn't really dead – Some people were willing to believe that Jesus was not really dead when He was put in the tomb such that He left on His own. First of all, the men who carried out the crucifixions were experienced at knowing when a person was dead. But beyond that, the idea that a man who had hung on a cross and had his side pierced by a sword could then push aside a large stone, overpower soldiers, and escape unnoticed seems pretty ludicrous.

They looked in the wrong tomb – It has been suggested that the women who went to the tomb that morning got lost and wound up at the wrong tomb. It is noted that the man they met said, "He is not here". What is left out is the full statement of the man (actually an angel) was, "He is not here: for he is risen" (Matthew 28:6). Also, Peter and John, who knew the location, later came to the same tomb and confirmed that the body was gone.

Joseph changed the burial site - It has also been suggested that Joseph of Arimathea moved the body of Jesus from his tomb to a nearby criminal's graveyard. First of all, it was against Jewish law to move a body after it had been buried. Second, Joseph surely would have corrected the disciples had this been an actual case of mistaken location.

**Jesus Resurrected** – The most credible explanation for the empty tomb is that Jesus resurrected, just as He said He would. Many people were witnesses to encountering the risen Christ—they saw Him, heard Him speak, ate with Him, and felt the nailprints in His hands. All other possible explanations (as described above) do not hold up. Jesus is risen, which gives us a lively hope for the future that we will also resurrect and reign with Him forever in the eternal kingdom of God.

someone the hope of a new chance at life.

As a nurse, I've administered more blood transfusions than I can count. It's often like pumping life into patients' bodies. A blood transfusion can save a patient's life in minutes.

We don't know much about His life until he was
