God sent the perfect people at the perfect time to help us out of a pinch. (We got the shingles placed successfully that afternoon.) This is just one of the many times that the Lord has come through for our building project.

We are the Lakeside Branch of The Church of Jesus Christ in Arizona. Brother Ike and Sister Bonnie Smith first came to this rural area in 1969 to take the Gospel to the White Mountain Apache Tribe. They were soon joined by Brother Skip and Sister Cheryl Smith, Brother Herb and Sister Shirley Hemmings, and many others who labored faithfully for over 50 years to fulfill the Divine Commission.

Sister Bonnie Smith says, "It's a new day on the mountain! We are blessed beyond measure and rejoice to see the fulfillment of a longtime dream. After 53-plus years of meeting in various homes of saints and friends, community centers, and our double-wide mobile church, our hopes of a permanent structure are coming to fruition."

s it time to change your trajectory? Sometimes a cleansing confession precedes such discovery: your current trajectory is not getting you where you want to be. This need not create frustration, which is often an offspring of inactivity. Denial obstructs personal growth, so you must invite change into your life. Rather than burying your emotions, dig them up and confront them. In order to realize your gain, you absolutely must address and embrace the pain; then empower it to provide inspiration and direction. You cannot start something new until you stop something old.

Pause. Exhale. Consider your situation. Address your situation with prayer and invite God in, giving Him full access into all of your life. Trade out the stagnation of negativity and trade it with the progress of positivity. One tactic: replace negative frustrations ("I can't...") with positive affirmations ("I will..."), which are built upon faithful desires ("I want..."). Focus on the "What?" and the "How?" vs. the

"Let Him Change Your Trajectory"

"That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." (John 3:6)

"Who?" Too often, the "Who?" concludes with blaming someone, or worse, everyone.

Pause again. Exhale. Consider your game plan. Now that you are emphasizing change and developing a growth plan through gained perspective, process all of this. Without making any rash judgments ("It can never happen"), nor quick decisions, explore your opportunities and options. Mindfully anticipate your results ("start with the end in mind") and formulate a comprehensive plan. Once framed, share your plan with someone you've identified as a viable accountability partner. Secondly, find a spiritual leader who has successfully changed their trajectory, and bring them in as an added mentor.

You are now ready for your last, deliberate step in changing your trajectory, which is the most critical facet to success: relinquish control! Consider the example of John Baptist; after baptizing the lord, John spoke directly to his inner circle, and explained how his own trajectory was changing. He told them to acknowledge the Savior by shifting their allegiance to Him. He explained his impending lessening and Jesus' upcoming expansion this way, "He must increase, but I must decrease." But this statement had a much deeper application, as the spiritual context of this holds the secret to "Let Him change your trajectory." "He must increase" = more of Jesus Christ in your life

"I must decrease" = less of you (ego); submit to His Spirit

When Jesus said, "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit," He was speaking to such change. This proactive lessening of vourself comes through downsizing or eliminating pieces and parts of you that are keeping you from fully becoming, spiritually, personally, emotionally, professionally, etc. We are each indiscriminately magnetic, as our life experiences remain with us, whether by desire or circumstance, consciously or subconsciously. Many of these are best purged (discarded), as they represent shards and fragments that bring serious negative impact, causing real harm, physically, mentally, emotionally, and/or spiritually. The deliberate release of this extra weight allows for your smoother, surer, more directed flight towards your goal(s) and vision(s).

When you lessen or eliminate these hindrances, you create the void which provides space for God's Spirit within you. Once He makes His way in, His clarity and direction can effectively change your trajectory.

Only you can decide whether it is time to change your trajectory. It is? Then, start cleaning out...

"We'll have more room for all of the wonderful outreach events we have throughout the year, such as Vacation Bible School, the Fall Festival, our Ladies' Circle teas and dinners—and we'll have actual classrooms!" We're Building a Building, but God Is Building Up His People

The experience of watching the building go up has been

inspiring. Sister Cheryl Smith says, "For me, I personally felt His Spirit during the day the trusses were being put in place. It was breathtaking to see the process and how the brothers were working so hard to secure them. And the ceiling is so high! I just knew that God had sent His angels to protect them. It was a beautiful sight to behold."

The building is physically beautiful due to the architectural design by Brothers Timothy and Jonathan Scolaro from the Mesa Branch. But what's even more beautiful is how the Lord is building up the congregation that will use the Church as a home base to worship and minister.

Presiding Elder Brother Emil Palensar describes how our building project has changed our branch for the better. "The building project has brought excitement. Giving is way up. Everyone is praying for the project. Also, a lot of folks in the community ask about how it's going."

When I asked Brother Dylan Palensar how he's seen God at work in the project, he remarked on how quickly it's moving along. One of the reasons why the project has progressed so speedily is because we've had many brothers and sisters from around the Church—even from as far as Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania—who have traveled here to work (and work hard). One brother spent the first month of his retirement working on our building nearly every day. The Mesa Branch in our region has been a huge support. We've even received help from other groups in the community.

In September 2022, we had nearly 20 helpers from around the Church participate in a weeklong work party. In just seven days, we framed all the exterior walls, installed a majority of the wall sheathing, and placed all the trusses.

"Sisters pitched in with drinks, lunches, and dinners. Building the Church has brought more fellowship, friendship, interaction, and vision," says Brother Pat King.

"Everyone was able to do some little thing. The help of everybody in our area, in our Church...it's just a really wonderful thing to watch," says Sister Joann Cotellesse.

Do Bee Stings Disrupt Your Book of Mormon Faith?

M y wife and I started a beach vacation several years ago with a walk along the crystal waters and powdered sand. Out of nowhere, a shooting pain fired through my foot. I had stepped on a bee. Not being allergic, the small pain did not ruin the walk, much less the vacation. My foot hurt for a minute or two, but the blessing of where I was and who I was with far outweighed my painful surprise.

Spiritually, we all too often allow petty differences and minor criticisms to take us away from the Lord and His Church. A misinterpretation of scripture, a different church's doctrine or a comment from somebody who has never even attended The Church of Jesus Christ sometimes derails saints without a sturdy backbone to their faith. A sting from the opposition might come and we forget the beauty of where the Lord plants us. Nothing should separate us from the living waters of the pure gospel and the Lord's chosen saints of the latter day.

Imagine rejecting the Word of God over one issue, which in the end isn't even an actual problem. For example, critics often levy Alma 7:10, contending it contains an obvious mistake. The scripture prophesies of the birth of Jesus Christ saying, "he shall be born of Mary, at Jerusalem which is the land of our forefathers". The presumed problem is Jesus was not born in the city of Jerusalem. He was born in Bethlehem.

Don't let this (or any) attempted sting from an unbeliever usurp your trust in the Word of God. Sure, Jesus was not born in the city of Jerusalem, but that is not what the text says. Read it again, carefully. The prophecy reports Jesus would be born in the <u>land</u> of Jerusalem. Bethlehem is only 8 miles from Jerusalem; could that be considered within the land of Jerusalem?

In 2012, archaeologists discovered a seal in Jerusalem mentioning Bethlehem. They reported the artifact as confirming both the existence of Bethlehem in Jesus' day and its relationship with the much larger neighboring city of Jerusalem. A series of clay tablets from Upper Egypt go even further. The clay tablets, called the Armana Letters, include engravings that state, "And now as for Jerusalem—Behold this land belongs to the king" and "But now even a town of the land of Jerusalem, Bit-Lahmi by name, a town belonging to the king, has gone over to the side of the people of Keilah." (emphasis mine) The consensus of Biblical scholars confirms Bit-Lahmi to be an early form of the New Testament's Bethlehem. Ancient authors in Egypt considered Bethlehem to be inside the land of Jerusalem.

The convergence with the Book of Mormon is astonishing. Ancient authors in the Book of Mormon affirm Jesus would be born in Jerusalem, the land of their forefathers. Archaeology confirms through ancient inscriptions from the Middle East that Bethlehem was a town inside the land of Jerusalem. This makes the Book of Mormon historically accurate beyond anyone's available knowledge from the 1820s and 30s.

What once was a sting against the Word of God now silences critics. What if we didn't have the Armana Letters? What if the bullae had never been excavated in Jerusalem? The Book of Mormon was always historically accurate, even when the criticism appeared obvious at the surface. Archaeology now dissolves this attempted criticism into obscurity, but spiritual truth does not depend on a trowel. A trowel only unearthed a truth that the Book of Mormon already contained.

How many believers have allowed this small critique to prohibit them from taking the Book of Mormon seriously? How many have been stung by online reports not understanding the archaeological support? How many of us allow whispers and rumors to strip our faith and take us away from the truth contained in the Word of God. Saints, let us never miss the beauty of the Lord, His Church and His Word from false attacks by the enemy of our souls.

As we live through the latter-day period and anticipate the restoration of the House of Israel, it is a blessing to know that the Gentiles (which includes many of us) have a great role to play in this effort. Here are 5 amazing facts describing how the Gentiles are being used and will be used in the latter-day work of The Church of Jesus Christ.

Bringing Forth of the Book of

Mormon –The cover page of the Book of Mormon describes the contents as "an abridgement of the record of the people of Nephi, and also of the Lamanites...sealed by the hand of Moroni, and hid up unto the Lord, to come forth in due time by way of Gentile." Joseph Smith was the Gentile who received the records and he and other Gentiles were used in the translation of the records.



Restoration of The Church of Jesus Christ – The Gentiles

have been used to establish and lead The Church of Jesus Christ in this dispensation of time such that the restored gospel of Jesus Christ has been shared with many people, even as we prepare for the eventual gathering of Israel and appearance of Jesus Christ. "The Lord God will proceed to do a marvelous work among the Gentiles, which shall be of great worth unto our seed; wherefore, it is likened unto their being nourished by the Gentiles and being carried in their arms and upon their shoulders." (1 Nephi 22:8)

Preparing for the Choice Seer -

As Lehi describes in 2 Nephi 3, the Lord told Joseph of old that "a seer will I raise up out of the fruit of thy loins; and unto him will I give power to bring forth my word unto the seed of thy loins – and not to the bringing forth my word only, saith the Lord, but to the convincing them of my word, which shall have already gone forth among them" (2 Nephi 3:11). One sister texted and asked me if anyone was with me and when I

listed the sisters that were there, she said, "That's quite a posse" and I answered, "Yes, a sister posse" and she replied, "The best kind."

They are the best kind. They stayed for hours. We laughed, we ate, and we waited and waited. There was a complication during the surgery, and the procedure could not be completed that day. It had to be completed the following week. Some of those sisters came back again and waited hours with me again and would not leave until my husband was settled in his room.

How blessed am I? How blessed are we to have that kind of love for one another? My whole life I have known this love being "born and raised" in The Church of Jesus Christ. But sometimes, the love and devotion that you are shown strikes a beautiful chord in your heart and must be shared. I will not soon forget this love and I pray that I show the same love in return. Children's Corner



Dear Friends,

Did you ever go to sleep really mad at someone or something and wake up with those upset thoughts still on your mind? Did someone at school or in the family bully you, make fun of you, pick you last for a team sport? Did someone you thought was your really good friend go with someone else, make fun of you, or say mean things about you?

Maybe someone in your family is very sick and they're not getting better. Or there is going to be a divorce and things have changed. Your heart actually hurts. You worry and you see your family is worried. We all are human. Some of these bad things will happen as we grow up and handle life.

If we do not learn how to handle the problems of life, we face deep sadness and even bitterness. Since many of the things above have happened in my life, I can tell you that I'd rather be happy instead of angry, bitter, and upset. So what do I do when these bad things come into my life? First, I go somewhere where I can think and talk to God. Sometimes I am so upset I talk in a loud upset voice. Or I pray by telling God "what is going on?" Then I often ask a wise friend in the Church if I can talk with them and get advice. Or I go and talk to a counselor who is trained in helping people find patterns and change. I listen to them. I pray more for God to help me. Many times over the years when I was really troubled, I asked for the elders to pray for me to have strength to do the right thing also. The scriptures will tell us how to live.

And how do the scriptures tell us to get through these times? When people hurt you, Jesus tells us to forgive, forgive, and forgive. The Apostle Peter asked him just "how many times do we have to forgive my brother or sister who sins (does something wrong) against me?" (See Matthew 18:22.) Up to seven times? "He asked.

Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." Then he told them a story to give the example. He said, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts (find out who owed him money) with his servants.

As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand bags of gold was brought to him. The law said this man could be put in prison, or he and his whole family sold as slaves and the money be paid back.

What To Do When Someone Hurts You?

The man cried and begged the king not to do this and to forgive him. (See Matthew Chapter 18.) The king forgave him and sent him on his way.

As the man came home, he saw a person who owed him some money and he turned on this man and put him in prison for the small amount of money that he was owed! So, even though he'd been forgiven, he now did not forgive someone else. The King heard about his hard heart and bad deed and sent him to prison.

This story is about us being forgiven by God. All of our sins and wrong things that we do can be and are forgiven by God if we repent (be sorry). We can lose our worry and anger and feel clean inside. And we are supposed to also forgive others!

That doesn't mean you have to continue to go by the person who has hurt you. The Bible also tells us in Matthew 7:6 not to share precious things with some people who are mean. If we tell them something precious, they might turn on us, trample what we said into the ground and try to rend (tear at) us. We are told, "Don't cast your pearls before swine (mean people) lest they turn and trample them under and rend you."

So you can be careful who you share precious things with. Meanwhile, praise God every day, over and over, for all of the good things in your life! Are you healthy? Can you walk? Can you read? Do you have a safe place to live and have enough to eat? Are you loved? And also be thankful that you know there is a God in heaven who cares for you and will help you, every day, in every way. Just ask Him and be very grateful!
