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# Fifth Oklahoma Outreach

How do we measure success? Nephi wrote, "For after the book of which I have spoken shall come forth, and be written unto the Gentiles, and sealed up again unto the Lord, there shall be many which shall believe the words which are written; and they shall carry them forth unto the remnant of our seed." (II Nephi 30:3). This action was confirmed during one of our days of fast and prayer, when one of our brothers, while praying, was inspired by phrase "great and marvelous are thy works, O Lord", which he researched both in the Bible and Book of Mormon. After he related his inspiration during one of the pre-trip conference calls, another brother said he had an experience several weeks prior to the call, wherein he heard a voice say, "I have done a marvelous work and wonder; go tell it!" Such is our calling and vocation.

How do we measure success? This trip was the fifth to the state of Oklahoma. We paid particular attention to building on established relationships, as well as making new ones. We met with 24 people (10 tribes) and 29 newly contacted people (7 new tribes). We estimate that since 2009 almost 180 people have received detailed descriptions of The Church of Jesus Christ message through conversations and presentations, along with books, pamphlets and literature, not counting numerous others who have received fliers and First Voices Journals or which we shared brief chats. In all cases we have been well-received and welcomed back. There are 36 tribal organizations in Oklahoma and we have had some type of intensive contact with over 30 of them.

How do we measure success? We are thankful for our relationships. They are willing to make arrangements with other Native Americans on our behalf or provide names of other Native Americans who would be interested in the Lord's message. Specifically, we were provided additional contacts in North Carolina, Missouri, and several other cities in Oklahoma. Additionally, those whom we spent time with have shown a greater willingness to share their spiritual experiences with us.

How do we measure success? We were given the opportunity to anoint this wise and instrumental tribal leader and to ask for God's healing power. Prayer was welcomed and also offered for another leader after she related the personal tragedies her family has suffered since our last visit. In another location, a church building was acquired for our use. After a season of singing in their tribal language and spoken testimonies, the meeting was turned over to us. We then proceeded to expound the scriptures regarding the lineage of Abraham, particularly Judah and

Joseph, closing with the connection to the Native Americans and their future. During the presentation, our host distributed our flyers for us! The pastor closed the meeting by quoting Ezekiel 37:19 (two sticks as one in the hand of God), not fully realizing its true meaning, but opening the door for more discussions.

How do we measure success? In one location we ran into some opposition, but we persevered and at the conclusion, e of the brothers, stood, walked around the desk and hugged the man who had displayed the opposition. He invited us back! Two others who disagreed with the premise of the Church's message welcomed us back and shared more about themselves then they had in past visits. In another relationship, we were invited to a grand council, which is to take place some time this year – a true honor. Others are still intrigued with the message and are seeking answers.

How do we measure success? By our hosts sharing sacred stories about "the healer" that had come among them. And about the similarities to Ancient Israel and sacred relics that are not shared with others. Still others tell us about how they have read the Book of Mormon, but need additional explanation and guidance (providing us the opportunity to expound the purpose of it and the coming of the choice seer) or thanking us for explaining Old Testament names and lineage.

As a side note, anytime we note the location of the Church headquarters in Monongahela, Pennsylvania, it is immediately recognized as a Native American word. So we remind them that the Church that is sharing such a message of hope is the one with the Native American name. And the Lord reminded us what this activity was all about when we passed a sign in Apache, Oklahoma, that read, "Welcome Home Joseph." How fitting! Our hope is that one day, a sign like that will be posted in each town or city where the Native American people reside.

How do we measure success? In one location, after speaking to the chief, a humble and spiritual man, we asked if we came back could we share some power point presentations which go into more detail concerning our beliefs about Native People and he agreed. Another woman whom we have met with several times and who brings others to the meeting, did not want us to leave without seeing her and sharing some time with her. A new location brought us to a language school where we were warmly received and given the opportunity to share the message to the eight people sitting there.

\*\*'s obvious how success is measured: it is measured by fulfilling the scriptures. Besides the verse in II Nephi 30:3, we see fulfillment of II Nephi 3:11 and III Nephi 21:26.

Some of our elders and members have also been involved with missionary work internationally and domestically in Dominica, Venezuela and Homestead.

## **International Church -- Philippine Missions**



The Church is established in three locations among the Philippine Islands with 269 members. The Philippine work began on September 21, 1998, with a letter from someone requesting information about the Church.

The first trip to the Davao City area was made in 2000 with Philippine ministers ordained in 2001. In 2002 ministers from Mindanao were inspired to take the Gospel to family members on the island of Bohol. By the end of the year, there were 17 members baptized, two elders and one deaconess ordained there. The work has continued to expand and in April 2009 a mission was started in Pagadian City, through another independent inquiry.

Our missions with 125 members plus 50 children are on the island of Mindanao in the Davao City area. All the missions are located in the mountains; they meet in block buildings and are separated by one to two hours travel with an elder at each location.

On Mindanao, is the Pagadian City Mission. There are eight members and they conduct a Sunday School where they teach and feed 25-40 children of poor families in an open-air science center owned by Brother Edison Abraham, the elder in charge.

our missions, 136 members and almost 100 children, are on the island of Bohol located in the highest part of the mountains, sepated by about 30 minutes travel time. All are serviced by Elder Orencio Jaso.

We always enjoy many special song selections at each mission we visit. The people love to sing and they all play instruments and sing well. We also enjoy the testimonies and fellowship as most of our members can speak English. Please pray for the work here.

"For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will" (I Corinthians 12: 8-11).

🎮 piritual gifts are one of the most special things the Lord can give to a man or woman. First of all, the gift is ongoing. The gift is given to a person for their entire life. It never goes away, and is used over and over again, for the uplifting of that person, and often times, for everyone around them. How beautiful is it when we hear of a vision, dream or hear the gift of tongues. It is then we all feel very connected to God, as if He is speaking directly to His Church, or as individuals.

Paul is very clear in his writings above that these gifts are given by the SAME Spirit. He mentions that four times in the short verses above to be sure we understand the SAME Spirit of the Lord manifests in different ways, but will always "feel" or "sound" the same. This is how we know it is a true gift from the Lord. Why did Paul emphasize that? Because we know that there is an opposition to all things. The magicians were able to duplicate many miracles that Moses did in his day, and the devil is no different today. But it "feels" and "sounds" different. 

**Bridging the Gap**

uring the October 2011 General Church Conference, the following dream was presented and accepted as a revelation from God:

Another Brother Elder, a Brother Deacon, and I were standing at the bottom of a hill talking. We must have been attending some kind of Church gathering because the youth were all playing together. After a while we noticed that the youth were missing. We heard their voices coming from the other side of the hill. We started to walk up the hill at an angle to intercept them. The sky was getting dark as evening was approaching. We hurried our pace for concern of their welfare was intensifying as darkness approached. We broke the crest of the hill laboring from the steep incline. We saw the youth slightly below the crest of the hill to our right. Then I noticed something else: dogs—nothing but dark outlines of big dogs. They looked at us with yellow glowing eyes

It their attention was on the youth. We screamed at the kids to run down the hill, we ran at an angle to intercept them before the dogs did. We realized that we weren't going to make it so we screamed at the dogs trying to get their attention on us to no avail. The dogs over took our youth and started to carry them away. One of the Brother elders said, "Kneel." Doing so, he started to pray. "Dear Father, please Lord spare the youth from such a horrible death." There was a loud noise and a bright flash of light and the dogs were gone but so were some of the youth.

Although most individuals in the Church have read this dream or heard it referenced, the GMBA officers feel inspired to relay the key message of the revelation: The Church of Jesus Christ must BRIDGE THE GAP between the older and younger generations to keep the young people safe. This has

come the GMBA's primary mission, d the officers want to let the younger generation know how important they are to the Church.


The first effort by the GMBA to "bridge the gap" was held on Saturday evening during the October 2011 General Church Conference. With the younger and older generations in attendance, the officers conducted an interactive presentation in the World Conference Center. Placing the young people on the left side of the auditorium, and the older individuals in the center of the auditorium, a gap between the groups was created. This gap represented the generational divide between the young and old, as well as the opportunity for both groups to "reach out" to another. Next, the GMBA officers displayed a PowerPoint presentation while they asked the groups several engaging questions. If a question pertained to certain individuals, they were asked to stand. The intent of this exercise was to comprehend how both groups felt about the divide between the generations, helping both groups gain a clearer understanding of themselves and each other, as well as determine how to "bridge the gap." Then, the officers presented a few recollections from the older generation, who reminisced about Church members who had positive impacts on their lives. By the end of the night, both groups had a clearer understanding about the gap and how to fuse it together.

A month later, another activity was held after the Saturday night business meeting during the 2011 November GMBA Conference. This "General Night of Fun and Fellowship for All Ages" was held at the Hempfield Township Athletic Complex. The event included food, games, and music, allowing everyone to interact with each other in a casual setting. Also, the night included a "Are You Smarter Than a Fifth Grader" game. What made the game unique is how it implemented the "bridging the gap" mission. Children were contestants for the game, while teenagers and adults participated as the audience. However, if the kids did not know a correct answer, they were allowed to ask anyone in the audience for help. The game was a great deal of fun, not only because it was a rendition of a popular TV game show, but because all the children, teenagers, and adults were able to participate. The children depended upon the audience for help, while the audience gave their assistance through helpful hints and encouraging cheers.

The underlying intent of this activity was to encourage everyone to feel comfortable with their strengths and weaknesses in trivia knowledge. If a child did not know a correct answer, they could ask someone from the audience. And if an audience member did not know a correct answer, they could easily refer to someone else. The game demonstrated that everyone, whether young or old, has weaknesses, and that support can be obtained if people depend upon each other, care for another, and pay attention to their peers' needs.

The activities held during the October and November conferences tried to demonstrate that the generational gap needs to be closed by both groups. The older generation must mentor the young people who need guidance, while the younger generation must reach out to those older individuals who are more stable and experienced in the Church.

With this combined effort, the GMBA officers hope the children will not be swept up by wolves, but instead, will be nurtured by the Lamb. The Church looks forward to seeing both generations at the next GMBA event!

## Surrender to Jesus While There is Still Time

was listening to an old CD recently, when I heard the song Look To The Right, Child being sung. I know I've probably heard that song hundreds of times, but that day when I listened to it a couple things struck me. "Surrender to Jesus while there is time" I think when I have sung or heard this verse before I considered myself exempt, or, I think that it is a completed step. I've already done it, so somehow it doesn't apply to me. I realized the other day that surrendering to Jesus takes many forms.
